Save water this summer

The water supply at Tidal River Campground is operating on reduced water storage this summer. To help the water storage system cope, Parks Victoria is asking all visitors to help save water and reduce their water use during their stay.

Did you know?

Tidal River Campground is 'off-grid'. That means that all water and electricity come from inside the Prom. For water, it's drawn from the Tidal River catchment, treated to a drinking water standard, stored in a series of tanks, and then distributed around the campground for visitors to enjoy.

You can help by:

- Filling up your caravan water tanks before arrival.
- Taking shorter showers – 4 minutes or less.
- Turning off taps when brushing teeth.
- Using less water to wash dishes – use a tub and don't leave the tap running.
- Taking your laundry home.
- Using a caravan dump point outside of the Prom for caravan waste.
