Park Update - What's open, what's closed?



18 November 2025

Park Overview

During the summer of 2024/2025, multiple bushfires impacted the central, southern and western areas of the Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park. Since then, many popular visitor areas have re-opened. Some visitor sites remain closed while we work towards completing a staged recovery program. This park update provides an overview of what is currently open and what is closed.

Open day visitor sites & walking tracks

Full trail now open – *Day walks only in Central GPT Section Borough Huts to Yarram Gap Road (C2 - C5) and Southern Section - Yarram Gap Road (S1 – S2) Hike-in Campgrounds remain closed.

Dispersed camping – as per park regulations (see park
visitor guide) *some sites are closed due to bushfire
impacts, signage installed.

Open Roads and 4WD Tracks

Many roads and tracks within the National Park have
reopened. Due to significant flood damage post fire,
some closures remain in place.

Closed Day Visitor Sites, Walking Tracks and Campgrounds

**Mount Zero Carpark/Mura Mura GPT trailhead is
closed for trailhead upgrades**

No day parking available, drop off pick up only,
alternatively day visitors can park at Stapylton
Campground to access Stapylton Loop walk, Stapylton
Summit walk, Flat Rock area and Mt Zero walk (note this
will add additional km's to each walk).

Wonderland, Serra and Mt William Range Area

Grampians Peaks Trail – Long Distance Walk

Central GPT Section - Borough Huts to Yarram Gap

Road (S1 – S2) Open for day walks only, Hike-in
Campgrounds remain closed in these sections. Bush
camping is not permitted along the trail.

Mt Zero/Mura Mura trailhead – No parking, drop off pick
up only during trailhead upgrades.

Stay safe and be prepared

The Grampians (Gariwerd) landscape is recovering after
bushfires. Native plants, animals and ecosystems are
fragile. Stay in open visitor areas only and remain on
designated tracks. Leave no trace of your visit.

Be mindful of changed landscapes, damaged trees, soft
hidden holes and potential flash flooding after heavy
rainfall. Always check weather conditions before you
set out.
